Where We've Been...

- May 2022: Bond Passed
- Fall 2022: Zonda Demographics provided the Fall Demographic Report
- January 2023: Argyle ISD Board of Trustees adopted a 10-Year Strategic Growth Plan
- April/May 2023: Zonda Demographics provided the Spring Demographic Report

Where We Are Now...

- October 2023: New Bond & Growth Planning Committee Commenced
- October 27, 2023: State Enrollment Snapshot Date Official Enrollment
- November 13, 2023: Zonda Demographics provides the Fall Demographic Report

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Adopted 10-Year Growth Plan Continuous Analysis Expectations

- District & Board of Trustees examine growth semi-annually and plan accordingly
- Review & revise growth outlook plan as needed
- Continual review of bonding capacity
- Collaboration with district's demographer (Zonda) & district's financial advisor (RBC)
- Continuing collaboration with local municipalities

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Adopted 10-Year Growth Plan Guiding Parameters

- Elementary Campuses (PK-5):
 - Maintain 850-student capacity elementary schools
- Middle Schools (6-8):
 - 1,200-student capacity for middle schools. One MS will serve
 6-8th grades; other would utilize 6th Grade Campus (formerly AIS) & 7-8th grade campus.
- High School Configuration (9-12):
 - Remain one high school until AHS at CF reaches 2,700 students
 - Utilize 377 campus for 9th graders when CF reaches capacity until splitting to two high schools
 - When 2,700 is reached, split into two separate 9-12 high schools (utilizing Canyon Falls and US 377 campuses)



Demographer's Reporting District Takeaways for 10-Year Plan

- Final Enrollment #s do not change
- The variable is "when" enrollment numbers happen
- Semi-Annual Review of 10-year plan continues to be important to adjust based on demographic data

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Current Bond and Growth Planning

- Strategic Growth Plan in January 2023 indicated an expected bond in 2024 or 2025 to include at least Elementary No. 6, Middle School No. 2, High School additions at Canyon Falls campus & US 377 campus
- BGP Committee began on October 24, 2023 and will engage in 6 sessions, including facilities and capacity assessment reports
- BGPC is scheduled to provide recommendation to the Board of Trustees in January 2024

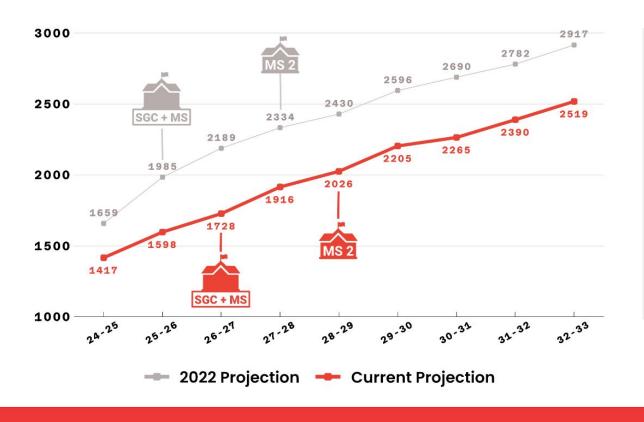

CONSENSUS & GRADIENTS OF AGREEMENT

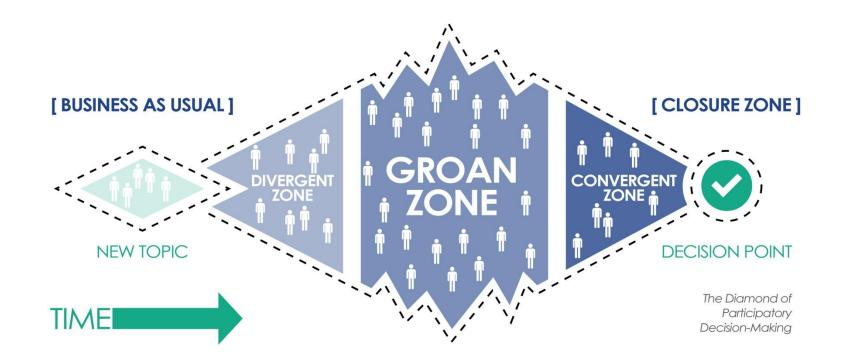

This scale makes it easier for participants to be honest. Using it, members can register less-than-whole hearted support without fearing that their statement will be interpreted as a veto.





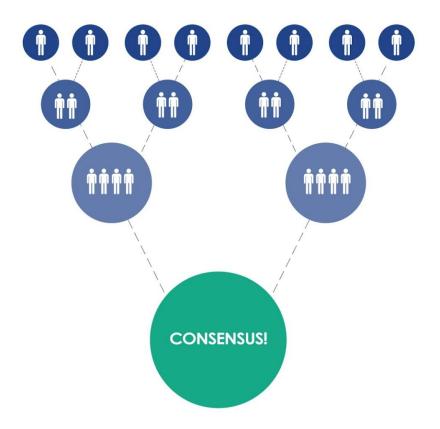
DYNAMICS OF GROUP DECISION-MAKING

LONG RANGE FACILITY PLAN CONSIDERATIONS

Argyle ISD Superintendent and District Leadership has partnered with VLK Architects to develop the District-Based Long-Range Facility Plan to meet the needs of Argyle ISD students for the next 10 years and beyond.

LONG RANGE FACILITY PLAN CONSIDERATIONS

Construction Costs Drive

BUILDING COMPONENTS BREAKDOWN

Foundation:

 Dictated by geotechnical conditions and the life expectancy of a public school

Structural System:

Dictated by code and includes regional wind speed criteria (tornado)

HVAC System:

 Energy performance, air exchanges, controls, etc, dictated by code

Plumbing System:

Fixture count and water usage dictated by building code

Electrical System:

• Energy performance dictated by Energy Code

Roofing Systems:

 Energy performance and reflectance dictated by Energy Code

Envelope:

 Energy performance dictated by Energy Code; includes thermal resistance, air barrier, continuous insulation, insulated windows, air cavity ect.

Paving:

- · Paving material dictated by local ordinance
- Subgrade preparation dictated by geotechnical conditions

Earthwork:

- Maximum grades dictated by Texas Accessibility Standards
- · Compaction dictated by geotechnical conditions

Fire Protection:

· Fire rating dictated by building code

LONG RANGE FACILITY PLAN CONSIDERATIONS

PRIORITY LEVELS:

- Priority 1 MUST DO: Legal, Safety Reasons or Critical Replacements Life Expectancy 0 2 years.

 Deficiencies or conditions that directly affect the school's ability to remain open, or deliver the educational curriculum.
- Priority 2 SHOULD DO: Curricular, Instructional, Program Needs & System Replacements Life Expectancy 3 5 years.

 These items are needs that are necessary to the mission of the school, but may not require immediate attention.

 These items should be considered as necessary improvements requiring incorporation in order to maximize efficiency and usefulness of the Facility including additions, site improvements and improvements related to the educational curriculum.
- **Priority 3 WOULD LIKE TO DO:** Curricular, Instructional, Program Needs & System Replacements Life Expectancy 5 10 years.

Items or systems which are likely to require attention within the next 5 years, or would be considered an enhancement to the Instructional environment. The enhancements may be aesthetic or may provide greater functionality.

Priority M - MAINTENANCE ITEM: To be addressed with Maintenance or Other Funding Sources

As part of the Long-Range Facility
Plan, VLK performed facility conditions
assessments of instructional
campuses, administrative buildings,
maintenance warehouse, and
transportation facilities. These
assessments include the reviewing of
as-built drawings, conducting site visits,
reviewing district standards for new
construction, applying knowledge of
current building codes and architectural
barriers rules (accessibility requirements).
